Seeking out wisdom in every corner of daily life is a key Jewish value. The depth and breadth of Gratz programs reflects our commitment to this value. We are committed to providing educational opportunities that meet both the emotional and intellectual needs of our students.

The challenge, in today's frenetic and stressful times, is to compete with the other intense demands on young people's time. Gratz programming fully engages students with imaginative, challenging, and stimulating experiences. Students leave the Gratz environment with a heightened passion for Judaism, increased Jewish literacy, and respect for Jewish studies and learning.

A sampling of the diverse course offerings at Gratz:

Judaism & the Environment: In this survey course, students learn about Jewish ecology. They explore Jewish values and the



environment to discover the inter-relationships between them.

Talmud: What is this Mishna? Talmud? Halacha? Aggadah? This course provides a basic study of these texts and introduces students to the mysteries of the Talmud.

Contemporary Jewish Theology: In this course, students learn about the contributions of well-known Jews in the fields of politics, philosophy, science, and entertainment.



Education: This course prepares students to function as entry-level teachers in Jewish schools. The course provides an in-depth study of lesson-planning and classroom management. It also explores approaches to teaching and content in the areas of theology, Bible, Israel, history, ethics, and prayer.

Youth Leadership: This course prepares students to become successful young leaders. In class, students focus on educational and developmental theory, group dynamics, programming, and planning. Then they have an opportunity to put theory into practice with hands-on activities.

Mary Campbell Center Program: Students work with the mentally and physically disadvantaged residents in conjunction with professionals. They learn about community responsibility both in theory and in action. Immediately following every Mary Campbell Center visit, students reflect on their experience and share strategies for improved interaction.
